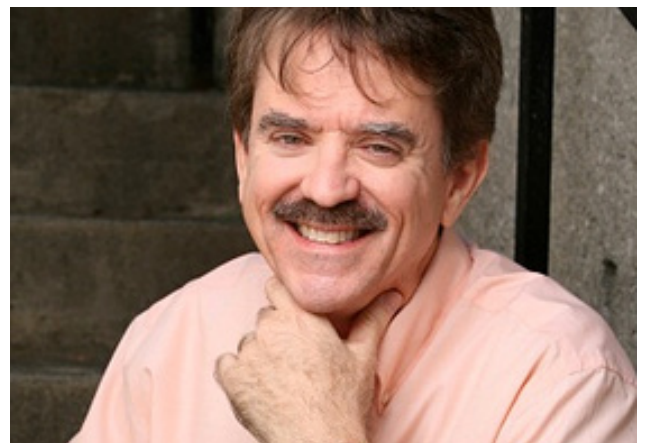

What a wonderful Sunday of worship we experienced last week! We know that God loves the World (John 3:16); and we know it is our responsibility to share that love far and wide. So we praise Him for showing us a part of the world that we do not know – India. God bless India! Blessed are we to be able to be a part of this ministry.

Speaking of our world, our missions committee is considering our position as a Baptist Church to be more formally associated with the Baptist World Alliance. In fact, there was a group from our church who attended the Baptist World Congress in Birmingham, England in 2005; a similar group attended the Hawaii Congress in 2010. It is always a taste of heaven to attend such a huge gathering of people from every race and language, celebrating our oneness in Christ, our unity in the faith and our love and loyalty to the One who made us! The Congress meets in Durban, South Africa in 2015. The BWA is a worldwide fellowship of Baptist churches and organizations. It was formed in 1905. Today the BWA is a fellowship of 231 conventions and unions in 121 countries and territories, **representing 42 million Baptist believers**. The purpose of the BWA is . . . *to manifest the essential oneness in the Lord Jesus Christ as the God and Savior of the churches of the Baptist order and faith throughout the world, and to promote the spirit of fellowship, service and co-operation among them, while recognizing the independence of each particular church . . .* Its mission remains the same: promoting unity, nurturing passion for missions and evangelism, responding to human need and promoting theological reflection.

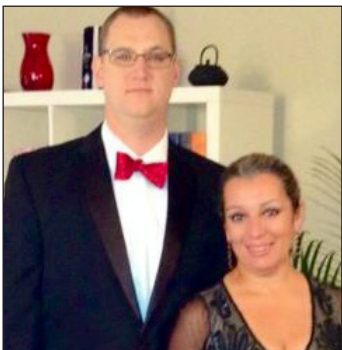

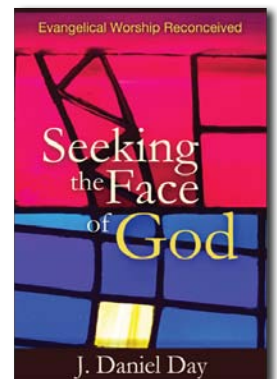
